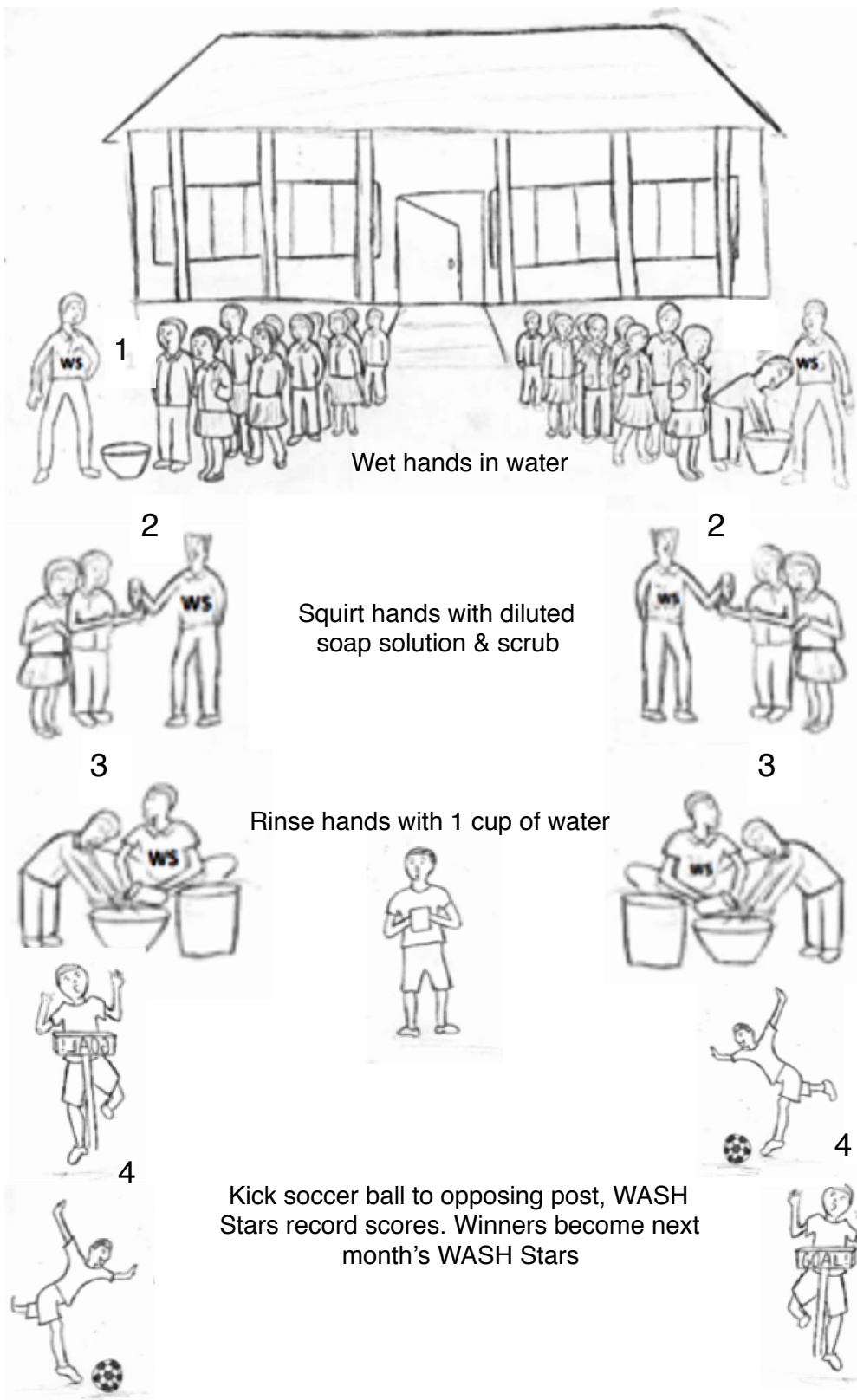


WASH League

Soccer-incentivized, water-conserving, student hand wash program *with soap*

Bring this program to your school



Significance: Diarrhea kills over 2,000 children every day. Sadly, this staggering loss can be avoided with the seemingly simple habit of hand washing with soap. Yet creating the habit has been an elusive goal. Though 1.7 m people wash their hands on Global Handwashing Day each year, there is little evidence that the activity persists after the day has ended.

The **WASH League** encourages students to wash their hands with soap through a fun soccer challenge with the aim to make the activity a lifelong habit. The WASH League minimizes resources and time by using small amounts of water supervised by peer assistants - the WASH Stars.

Key Players:

- Wash Stars: Students who are either selected by the teachers or win the soccer free kick the week before. These students assist their peers in the hand wash process.
- The students: Students are incentivized to properly wash their hands to qualify for a free kick

Materials:

- 2 5 Gallon buckets
- Recycled water bottle
- Cups (or 1/2 recycled water bottle)
- Basin/ Bucket
- Soap: diluted solution 15:1
- Water
- 2 Soccer balls
